The November meeting of the Lancaster County Fire Commission was held on Thursday, November 5, 2015 at the Lancaster County EOC at 111 Covenant Place at 7:00 p.m. Freedom of Information Act requirements were met by fax notification to The Lancaster News, The Herald, Kershaw News Era, Learn TV and Fort Mill Times. The agenda was also posted on the bulletin boards at the Lancaster County Administration Building and the EOC on Friday, October 30, 2015.

Chairman Timmy Baker called the meeting to order at 7:00. Scott Barton gave the invocation.

Visitor's Comments: Steve Willis wanted to inform the Fire Commission that he's not sure Council will meet the timeframe of January 1st for the bond on the fire trucks. He wanted to let them know they may possibly use the General Fund and pay it back when they get the bond.

Approval of October 1, 2015 Minutes – Tom Lever made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Greg Nicholson seconded the motion, which received unanimous approval.

Information Items:

- Grants Update – Darren Player stated there was nothing to report. All grants that we are aware of have been rejected. We will try again when the new grant cycle opens.
- Training Report – Keith Wilson reported to the Commission:
 - Fire Rescue has escorted 3,331 people through the Safety House which started September 2014. We will receive ISO credit. Any training for the public counts and every department should let Keith Wilson know.
 - DMICO at Buford Fire Department begins November 14th and 15th with 23 students registered.
 - Hazmat Operations – 0 is listed on the sheets; we only have four people that can take this class. We are going to have the class for these four people and we have asked York County and Kershaw County, through our Region 2 Coordinator, to send any people they may have. This class may be longer than normal.
 - We've had 309 members register for training this six months (July – December).
 - Classed have been submitted for January through June 2016. We have the following:
 - Firefighter I at Pleasant Valley Fire Department in February
 - I-400 at Kershaw Fire Department in February
 - Fire Service Supervision Increasing Personal Effect at Flat Creek Fire Department – March 5th & 6th
 - Municipal Approach to ARFF at Rich Hill Fire Department – March 12th & 13th
 - Rope Rescue Operations at Kershaw Fire Department – March 29th – April 3rd
 - Leadership I at Indian Land Fire Department – April 23rd & 24th
 - Aerial Operations at Pleasant Valley Fire Department in May
 - We are looking at adding 1152 class, I-300 class and a second rope rescue operations class.
 - The Training Officers' SAFER Grant representatives are Michael Kirkpatrick, Pleasant Valley, and Fred Plyler, Shiloh Zion.
 - A Pipeline Safety class will be held at Lancaster County Natural Gas Authority on November 10th from 6:30 to 8:00. Please RSVP to David Landry at (803) 216-3710.
 - There will be no Training Officers' Association meeting in November. They will meet on December 17th at 7:00.
- Maintenance Report – Billy Lloyd stated the monthly maintenance reports have been placed on the table. He stated the SCBA flow testing for half of the fleet is upcoming and will be performed on site at each station. He has contacted the vendor regarding dates.
- Budget Detail Account Inquiry – Darren Player stated the information provided in the package did not include headings. Please find the corrected copy on the table. He asked that all fire departments continue to send in their equipment orders and insurance/building repairs reimbursements. If anyone has any questions, please let him know and he will respond.

Action Items:

1. Discussion concerning Antioch Fire Department Request for SOG Variance on FR-1 Time (See Attached) – Darren Player reviewed current procedure on SOG 204.04 and stated on behalf of Antioch Battalion Chief Phillip Hall, they would like the Fire Commission to grant them a

variance to place Jhon Lienhart back on active status before the 90 days is over. He stated the 90 day window is up on November 18th. He also informed the Commission that changing a policy sets precedent. The request died for lack of a motion. No action taken.

2. Discussion concerning Commission Report to County Council (See Attached) – Darren Player stated Strategic Planning and Governmental Operations Committee provides the report for County Council. He stated the office can provide previous reports for your information, if necessary. There will be new member orientation on Monday, November 16 at 6:00 and RSVP is needed by November 12. No action taken.
3. Discussion concerning Approval of Annual Information Requests (See Attached) – Darren Player stated the sample information request has been provided for your approval. Tracy Caldwell made a motion to send the annual information request as presented. Tom Lever seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.
4. Discussion concerning Approval of Purchase of \$30 Gift Cards – Darren Player stated Arrowpointe Credit Union has provided the gift cards in the past. C.J. Addison made a motion to approve the purchase of \$30 gift cards from Arrowpointe Credit Union. Greg Nicholson seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.
5. Discussion concerning Acceptance of Shiloh Zion Cascade Compressor & Fill Station – Billy Lloyd stated Shiloh Zion received a grant three years ago and the procurement procedure was not followed. Now that the three year period on the grant has expired, they are requesting the County provide this service. It will cost \$280 additional funds from last year's contract. Greg Nicholson made a motion to accept the cascade compressor and fill station. C.J. Addison seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.
6. Discussion concerning Recruitment Retention Grant Progress – Darren Player stated Nathan Wall applied and has accepted the Coordinator position. He is scheduled to start on Monday, November 16, 2015. Once he starts, he will be coordinating meetings with each department.
7. Discussion concerning New Radio System – Darren Player stated he met with the Public Safety Committee of Council. He stated some of the towers are going to be placed on existing water tanks. The County is looking to buy a few parcels of land. We will need 9 sites to provide 95% coverage. Chris Nunnery will be handling the financial side. The goal is January 2017 to have everything in place and become operational. No action taken.
8. Discussion concerning Rescue Transition – Darren Player stated the Fire Commission approved the purchase of water equipment. We are working with Pleasant Valley and the City of Lancaster to determine what type of equipment is needed. No action taken.
9. Discussion concerning Fire Apparatus Purchase, Department Upgrades (See Attached) – Darren Player reviewed the bids, the bond and the upgrade costs for those departments wanting the upgrades. The Commission discussed and recommended that each department wanting upgrades must submit a letter of intent listing the options wanted that is signed by the Fire Chief and a Line Officer by Monday, November 30 at 5:00 p.m. The check for the upgrades must be submitted to Lancaster County by Monday, December 14th at 5:00 p.m. Tracy Caldwell made a motion to approve the recommendations. C.J. Addison seconded the motion which received unanimous approval. Darren stated Robbie Fore will be at the December meeting. He also stated that County Council will vote at the last meeting in November.

10. Discussion concerning Fire Commission Budget (See Attached) – Darren Player stated a calendar has been provided on the table. He stated budget requests are needed. The present budget
11. Discussion concerning Approval of Fire Department AFG Grants – Darren Player stated there is nothing new to report.
12. Standing Committee Reports:
 - Standard Operating Guideline Committee** – Tracy Caldwell stated the SOG Committee needs approval from the Commission to change the wording on all current SOG's from Lancaster County Fire Service to Lancaster County Fire Rescue. Tom Lever made a motion to change the wording on all SOG's to Lancaster County Fire Rescue. Greg Nicholson seconded the motion which received unanimous approval. Tracy Caldwell stated the social media SOG will be coming in the January meeting. He stated based on discussions last month, the foundation is releasing helmet camera footage or pictures must be approved by the Fire Chief before posting and no dead bodies will be shown. He stated Tony will be emailing the foundation out for comments or suggestions.

13. Commissioner Comments: Tom Lever stated he would like to see the pricing on the blue 911 signs stay in line across the County. He asked that the Commission discuss this next month. Elgin's BBQ will be held November 13th and 14th. Buford's BBQ will be held November 7th.

Rocky Hudson made a motion to adjourn. Ken Helms seconded the motion which received unanimous approval. Meeting was adjourned.

3. Any information that will be helpful for Finance during the budget process.


This report is due by January 4th. Please make this report a one page document.



2. A copy of the 2016 SCBA Fit Test form for every member who is certified by the Fire Chief to wear a SCBA as directed by the IST training program manual. (Enclosed)
3. A completed manpower survey for 2016. (Enclosed)
4. Please review attached Personnel Administrative Roster for each fire department member, provide rank, verify all information and advise this office of any discrepancies found. We ask that you add any additional contact numbers, especially a valid email address (if possible), as they will become critical for future communications. (Personal information other than mailing address will not be released without the express approval of the appropriate fire department member.)
5. Please list all members with station rank, helmet color and radio call number assigned to that member on the form provided. (Enclosed)
6. Please have members who wish to drive their privately owned vehicles (POV) to emergency responses per SOG 403.05 fill out the attached form. The Chief must approve the vehicle meets the requirements per SOG 403.05. Also, add the members name and vehicle make/model to the enclosed department list provided. You may make copies if additional forms are needed. (Enclosed)
7. The Chief and a line officer need to sign information review form before returning package to the Fire Service Office. (Enclosed)

According to Fire Commission Policy, failure to furnish this requested information by the above listed date could result in a loss of future equipment funding for your fire department.

5. Talk aloud and very slowly for several minutes counting backward from 100.
6. Jog in place / breathe normally.

S.O.G. Title: Personal Vehicle Response

S.O.G. 403.05

Adopted: 09-06-2007

Rescinds: 03-04-2004

I. Purpose:

This standard applies to all members of all fire departments in the Lancaster County Fire Service. It establishes requirements for the use of lights and sirens on personally owned vehicles. It further outlines the requirements necessary to obtain this privilege as well as the consequences of not following the guidelines herein.

II. General:

SC State Law (Section 56-5-170) defines Authorized Emergency Vehicles as:

Fire department vehicles, police vehicles, ambulances, and rescue squad vehicles which are publicly owned, other emergency vehicles designated by the (Highway) Department or the chief of police of a municipality and public and private vehicles while transporting individuals actually engaged in emergency activities because of the membership of one or more occupants of a fire department, police department, or rescue squad are "authorized emergency vehicles".

Operation of authorized emergency vehicles. (Section 56-5-760) outlines the privileges that emergency vehicle operators may take. They are:

1. park or stand, notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter.
2. proceed past a red or stop signal or stop sign but only after slowing down as may be necessary for safe operation;
3. exceed the maximum speed limit if he does not endanger life or property;
4. disregard regulations governing direction of movement or turning in specified directions.

The exemptions granted to an authorized emergency vehicle apply only when the vehicle is making use of an audible signal meeting the requirements of Section 56-5-4970 and visual signals meeting the requirements of Section 56-5-4700.

Section 56-5-4700 Audible signal devices and signal lamps for authorized emergency vehicles.

- Every authorized emergency vehicle shall, in addition to any other equipment and distinctive markings required by this chapter, be equipped with a siren, exhaust whistle, or bell capable of giving an audible signal.
- Every authorized emergency vehicle shall, in addition to any other equipment and distinctive markings required by this chapter, be equipped with signal lamps mounted as high and as widely spaced laterally as practicable, which shall be capable of displaying to the front two alternately flashing red lights located at the same level, and these lights shall have sufficient intensity to be visible at five hundred feet in normal sunlight. Provided that the vehicle when equipped with a mounted, oscillating, rotating, or flashing red light, visible in all directions for a distance of five hundred feet in normal sunlight, shall not be required to have additional signal lamps.
- The use of the signal equipment described herein shall impose upon drivers of other vehicles the obligation to yield right of way and stop as prescribed in Sections 56-5-2360 and 56-5-2770.

S.O.G. 403.05

Adopted: 09-06-2007

Rescinds: 03-04-2004

Section 56-5-4970 Sirens, whistle or bell on authorized emergency vehicle.

- Any authorized emergency vehicle may be equipped with a siren, exhaust whistle, or bell capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of not less than five hundred feet and of a type approved by the (Highway) Department, but such siren shall not be used except when such vehicle is operated in response to an emergency call....

Members of the Lancaster County Fire Service who desire to place the above outlined equipment on their POV must first obtain written permission from their fire chief. The fire chief has the right to deny this request for any reason that he deems appropriate. Only those members who are trained, per **SOG 402.07 Structural Firefighter Required Training**, in such a way as to positively affect the outcome of the emergency be given this privilege.

A member of the Lancaster County Fire Service whose vehicle is not equipped as outlined above, or who does not obtain permission from their fire chief, must respond to all calls in a non-emergency manner. All traffic laws must be obeyed at all times.

If a member chooses to place dash lights, strobe lights or any combination of lighting equipment that does not meet the SC state law for an authorized emergency vehicle, those lights may not be activated at any time the vehicle is in motion. They can be used only when the vehicle is stationary to warn or assist with directing traffic.

III. Responsibilities:

It shall be the right of any fire department to not allow use of lights on POV's of its members. This however does not keep a member of another fire department from operating properly placed emergency light and siren in that fire district when responding to an emergency traffic call.

It shall be the responsibility of chief officers and/or board of directors of each fire department to discipline any member of their station in violation of these guidelines.

Anyone who breaks traffic laws in a POV not properly equipped with lights and audible warning devices does so at their own risk. They are subject to disciplinary actions by the South Carolina Highway Patrol, the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office, the Lancaster County Fire Service, and the Fire Department of which they are a member.

IV. Required Documentation:

It will be the responsibility of the Fire Chief to complete a SOG 403.05 compliance form.

This form assures the compliance of the SC State Law (Section 56-5-170) with regard to equipment placement and operation.

This form assures the Lancaster County Fire Service that the member understands SOG 403.05 and SC State Law (Section 56-5-170).

The form will be signed by the Fire Chief and the member.

The form documents each specific vehicle listing year, make, model, and tag number.

A copy of the form will be filed at the fire department and the Lancaster County Fire Service office will also be forwarded a copy.


