Regular Meeting Minutes
September 3, 2015

The September meeting of the Lancaster County Fire Commission was held on Thursday, September 3, 2015 at the Lancaster County EOC at 111 Covenant Place at 7:00 p.m. Freedom of Information Act requirements were met by fax notification to The Lancaster News, The Herald, Kershaw News Era, Learn TV and Fort Mill Times. The agenda was also posted on the bulletin boards at the Lancaster County Administration Building and the EOC on Friday, August 28, 2015.

Chairman Timmy Baker called the meeting to order at 7:00. Tom Lever gave the invocation.

Visitor's Comments: Morris Russell stated he would be retiring from Lancaster County effective October 17, 2015. He stated he would be using vacation time and his last day in the office would be September 18, 2015. He stated he appreciates the support he received throughout his employment and will continue to be an advocate for Fire Rescue in the future. He encourages all Fire Commissioners to

make a difference in Fire Rescue and use the Fire Chief's Association when needed. He intends to relax through the end of the year and start a new adventure after the beginning of the New Year. He will continue to serve as Kershaw 2 at the Kershaw Fire Department. He also stated the County is allowing him to keep his current cell phone number.

Michael Gilson arrived at 7:03.

County Administrator Steve Willis commended Morris Russell for his hard work and dedication to the Fire Rescue service. He encouraged the Fire Commission to continue to build on the legacy.

*(See Attendance) Morris Russell left the meeting at 7:10 after a standing ovation.

Approval of August 6, 2015 Minutes – Greg Nicholson made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Matthew Baker seconded the motion, which received unanimous approval.

Information Items:

- Grants Update – Darren Player stated the grants will be presented under Action Items.
- Training Report – Keith Wilson reported to the Commission:
 - In July, we reported the new Infection Control video training program is working well. The scheduling has gone smoothly also. Please make sure the paperwork for Infection Control is signed by the Fire Chief. The Infection Control forms that are sent back to the station must be filed at the fire department. The Training Division is keeping paperwork for the office files. Please check your green sheets and anyone marked in red must not attend any training classes or run calls until completed.
 - Pump Ops I at Heath Springs Fire Department just finished August 30th. We started with 13 students and finished with 9 students. Pump Ops II is scheduled for October 17th and 18th at Kershaw Fire Department, with two students registered. Need more students for this class.
 - 1152 started with 12 students registered and now has 8 students.
 - STICO at Flat Creek Fire Department begins September 19th and 20th has 12 students registered. We need more students. (Officer Level Class)
 - Building Construction – Noncombustible at Gooch's Fire Department begins October 3rd and 4th with 11 students registered and needs more.
 - DIMCO at Buford Fire Department begins November 14th and 15th with 17 students registered.
 - The School Bus Extrication – 14 no shows for the classroom portion.
 - September 12 has 24 students
 - September 13 has 32 students
 - September 20 has 24 students
 - We will go over the rope equipment and equipment log at the Training Officer's Meeting on September 17th. Please encourage your Training Officer to attend this meeting. We will also be getting ready for classes scheduled January through June 2017. Planning will include Low Angle Rope Rescue.
 - We will also discuss the rope equipment at the next Fire Chiefs' Association Meeting on September 24th.

- Maintenance Report – Billy Lloyd stated the monthly maintenance reports have been placed on the table. He stated the CO monitors are on there last leg. They will be immediately swapped when they go out. The pump, ladder and aerial testing will be held in September/October.
- Budget Detail Account Inquiry – Darren Player stated the information provided in the package is for review only. If anyone has any questions, please let him know and he will respond.
- 1% Fire Department Distributions (See Attached) – Darren Player stated the 1% Fire Department distributions are provided for information only.

Action Items:

1. Discussion concerning Street Renaming (See Attached) – Darren Player stated there is no action necessary on this item. He reviewed the state law which requires street names must be changed to ensure efficiency of emergency response system. The list provided is not complete and will be ongoing. Steve Willis stated this item isn't an argument to fight and if any citizen questions you, you may refer them to the County Administrator's office. The Planning Commission will make the final decision. Darren Player stated these changes are being made and the firefighters need to be aware. Steve Willis stated the problem stems from short calls coming from cell phones and no GPS signals when inside a home. He stated letters will be sent addressing all changes. The general rule followed is the road with the most residents will be the road that keeps the address and other road(s) will change. No action taken.

Steve Willis left the meeting at 7:30.

2. Discussion concerning Report on Mid-Year Information Request (See Attached) – Darren Player stated every fire department is now compliant with the mid-year information request. No action taken.
3. Discussion concerning New Radio System – Darren Player stated the state contract has been signed. They are still in the planning stages and still looking for 95% coverage on hand-held radios. The Needs Assessment Committee will meet to make the decisions and are still hoping for 9 tower sites, but no dollar figure has been determined. No action taken.
4. Discussion concerning Rescue Transition – Darren Player stated the rope equipment was distributed this week. Please make sure the equipment is not placed near any petroleum products. He also informed the Commission that a leak was discovered in the seam of one of the boats. The Zodiac representative came and inspected, tested and found the leak. Darren stated we will be receiving two new boats. The training classes are continuing. Darren reminded the Commission that manpower is needed on all calls and encouraged response. No action taken.
5. Discussion concerning Fire Apparatus Purchase – Darren Player stated the bid packages will not be sent until Morris Russell is no longer in the office. We will send bid packages out on September 21 for opening on October 19th at 2:00. The bids must be opened and in County Council packages by Wednesday, October 21st for the meeting on Monday, October 26th. Darren stated that Council commented that every time they receive bids from the Fire Commission, they never get blow back from citizens. He stated this is very important. No action taken.

6. Discussion concerning Change in EMS Charging Policy – Darren Player stated traditionally firefighters have been transported by EMS and the bill has been forgiven and EMS would usually get any insurance payment. The new policy states firefighters will be charged whether they have insurance coverage or not. If you have insurance, EMS should be paid the amount the insurance company pays and the remaining will be written off. For those without insurance coverage, they will be charged the amount that insurance would normally pay. The same collection guidelines will apply to firefighters as others. Tracy Caldwell made a motion to send a letter to EMS requesting that active volunteer firefighters and their immediate family members (same household) be treated as they were in the prior policy whether they have insurance coverage or not. Greg Nicholson seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.

7. Discussion concerning 1% Reporting Change in Information Requested – Darren Player stated the state is requesting more detailed information on equipment. Darren reviewed the types of apparatus and what information is needed. He stated Billy Lloyd will email the Chiefs with the weights of the trucks. He stated please do not wait until the last minute to fill out this information that is due October 31st. No action taken.

8. Discussion concerning Fire Commission Budget – Billy Lloyd stated Lesslie Pump Testing Service quoted \$160 per pumper for 33 engines. This is a \$10 increase from last year and is still a great price. Hoosier Testing Services quoted the lowest bid on the ground ladder testing at \$1.20 per foot. Diversified Inspections quoted the low bid on the aerial ladder testing at \$500 each. Brooks Faulkenberry made a motion to accept these bids. Matthew Baker seconded the motion which received unanimous approval. Billy stated the pump testing will be held September 28 through October 2. Darren Player stated the equipment orders and the insurance/building repair reimbursements need to be returned as soon as possible. There is a possibility they may freeze the budget at the end of February. The Budget Analyst is looking at trends so the funds need to be spent. Darren also informed the Commission that turn-out gear sizing will be done at your station once the order is placed.

9. Discussion concerning SAFER Grant – Darren Player stated the grant has been accepted and approved by County Council. A Review Committee will need to be established consisting of Fire Commission Chairman, Vice Chairman, two members appointed from the Fire Chiefs' Association, the Director and Deputy Director along with one other staff member. This committee will need to set the criteria and the Coordinator will report to this Committee. No action taken.

10. Discussion concerning Approval of Fire Department AFG Grants – Darren Player stated Riverside Fire Department has been awarded and approved for their grant to purchase radios in the amount of \$42,000. Greg Nicholson made a motion to accept the grant with the match. Scott Barton seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.

12. Commissioner Comments: Camp Creek will have a hotdog sale on September 12th. Tracy Hardin addressed the Commission regarding the Privacy Act. He stated he is not opposed to

technology but one day there could be an issue on photos from body cameras which could impact Fire Rescue in a negative way. He stated cameras used for training purposes are okay. He stated he would like to see a policy established on social media. He stated if the Commission is going to allow helmet cameras and body cameras, we need education on what the cameras can be used for.

Scott Barton made a motion to adjourn. Rocky Hudson seconded the motion which received unanimous approval. Meeting was adjourned.

SECTION 23-47-60. Addressing.

(A) Local government, upon approval for implementation of a 911 system, shall standardize addressing within its area according to service supplier procedures. Enhanced 911 must not be placed in service until eighty-five percent of the residents have been provided with a standardized address by the local government. Those residents who do not have a standardized address provided by the local government will be placed in the service supplier's error file. Upon activation by enhanced 911 for the public, the service supplier's error file rate must not exceed one percent.

(B) Addressing costs are limited solely to establishing and maintaining addressing for a 911 system.

(C) Addressing must meet the following criteria:

(1) New street names assigned must not duplicate or be similar to an existing street name within the local government's geographical area

(2) Existing duplicate street names must be changed as necessary by the local government to ensure efficiency of the emergency response system.

(3) Each house, building, or other occupied structure must be assigned a separate number. A number or alphabetical letter must be assigned for each separate occupant within a building or other occupied structure. Examples include apartments, companies, etc.

(4) Written notification of the proper address of each house, building, or structure must be given to its owner, occupant, or agent in all instances where a new number has been assigned. Existing streets and addresses must receive verification of the correct address.

(D)(1) The owner, occupant, or agent of each house, building, or other structure assigned a number under a uniform numbering system shall place or cause to be placed the number on the house, building, or other structure within twenty-one days after receiving notification of the proper number assignment.

(2) Costs and installation of the number must be paid for by the property owner or occupant. Residential numbers must not be less than three inches in height. Business numbers must not be less than four inches in height. All numbers must be made of a durable, clearly visible material and must contrast with the color of the house, building, or other structure.

(3) Numbers must be conspicuously placed immediately above, on, or at the side of the appropriate door so that the number is visible clearly from the street. In cases where the building is situated more than fifty feet from the street or road, the building number also must be placed near the walk, driveway, or common entrance to the building, or upon the mailbox, gatepost, fence, or other appropriate place so as to clearly be visible from the street or road.

(4) Residents, businesses, owners, or others who fail to comply with this subsection are guilty of a misdemeanor, triable in magistrate's court, and, upon conviction, must be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days. Each day in violation constitutes a separate offense.

(E)(1) Mapping is extremely essential to an effective emergency response system and a requirement for addressing. Local government, through subscriber billing, may cause nonrecurring costs to be applied for hardware and software for purchasing and operating computerized mapping within the county 911 system in an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars. This nonrecurring cost is a part and may not exceed the maximum amounts that may be billed to an individual exchange line. Local governments with existing budgeted or planned computerized mapping are not eligible to bill subscribers for these type services.

(2) Local governments shall coordinate addressing and mapping with the telephone company, United States Postal Service, appropriate state agencies, and public utility companies.

(3) The 911 system must not be implemented by the service supplier until the local government notifies it that all requirements mandated by this section are fulfilled.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND SECTION 14.1.5, SUBSECTION 1, OF APPENDIX B OF THE LANCASTER COUNTY CODE (UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE OF LANCASTER COUNTY), RELATING TO THE PROCEDURE FOR CHANGING THE NAME OF AN EXISTING ROAD, SO AS TO ELIMINATE THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A PETITION WHEN THE REQUEST FOR A ROAD NAME CHANGE IS INITIATED BY THE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS DEPARTMENT; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO.

Be it ordained by the Council of Lancaster County, South Carolina:

Section 1. Road Name Change.

Section 14.1.5, Subsection 1, of Appendix B of the Lancaster County Code (Unified Development Ordinance of Lancaster County) is amended to read:

“Any person, firm, or corporation shall submit a written request to the planning department which proposes to change the name of a previously named road. Such request shall include any descriptive/locational information required by the planning department; designate a spokesperson by name, address, and telephone number; provide first and second road name choices; and be accompanied by a petition, signed by seventy-five (75) percent of the owners addressed on the affected road. The request must also include a reason for the name change. When the request is submitted by the Public Safety Communications Department, or its successor entity, for a road name change based on the provisions of Section 23-47-60(C)(2) of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, or when needed to rename road segments for computer aided dispatch database purposes, the requirement for the request to be accompanied by a petition does not apply.”

Section 2. Severability.

If any section, subsection or clause of this ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the validity of the remaining sections, subsections and clauses shall not be affected.

Section 3. Conflicting Provisions.

To the extent this ordinance contains provisions that conflict with provisions contained in the Lancaster County Code or other County ordinances, orders and resolutions, the provisions contained in this ordinance supersede all other provisions and this ordinance is controlling.


Section 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance is effective upon third reading.




